Epiphany season began on January 6. The liturgical year celebrates the life of Christ, and epiphany, which means ‘manifestation’ commemorates Christ’s revelation to the Gentile world as symbolized by the visit of the Magi with their three crowns on the *pulpit parament*. The ‘good news’ of the gospel made manifest to all the nations of the world is represented by green, the color of life and growth. The circle on the pulpit parament represents the earth across which the gospel message must travel. The four colors represent the four races of humanity to whom the gospel is sent in the four directions to circle the globe. The wreath on the *communion table parament* also uses the symbol of the crown which all those who accept Christ as Lord and Savior receive. It is the victory wreath of leaves the Christian ‘wears’ to indicate: “I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: henceforth, there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, shall give me at that day; and not me only, but unto them that love my appearing.” II Timothy 4:7-8

Parable of the Sower Banner: Luke 8:5-15 “The seed is the word of God...” In the parable of the sower the Lord Jesus uses several word pictures to teach the lesson that we must be “Doers of the word and not hearers only” (James 1:22). Seed well-planted, grown and ripened to harvest is a symbol of the faith that takes hold in the heart of the righteous, grows, and bears fruit (good works) which glorify God.

Parable of the Kingdom of Heaven Banner: Matthew 13:47 “The Kingdom of heaven is like a net that was let down into the lake, and caught all kinds of fish.” These symbols remind us of the work of Christ as the fisher of men, and His commission to His disciples to become fishers of men (Luke 5). The shape of the net suggests a shell, a traditional symbol of baptism, which is the sign and seal to believers that they are members of the kingdom of heaven.
