Today we gather in the shared faith of the apostles to worship our Lord Jesus, who has saved us by His grace. May you be blessed as we worship Him today. Welcome!

This morning we welcome **Mr. Jerry Van Someren** to join us in worship. Jerry has written the following in regards to today's service: "Today we will be remembering the beginning of the Reformation, when Martin Luther hung his 95 theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, on October 31, 1517. Five phrases that emerged during the Protestant Reformation and summarize the Reformers' basic beliefs are called the "Five Solas". Sola is Latin for "alone" or "only". These Solas are: Sola Scriptura (by Scripture alone); Sola Fide (by faith alone); Sola Gratia (by grace alone); Sola Cristus (through Christ alone); Soli Deo Gloria (glory to God alone). So, in summary, Protestant Christians believe that we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, because of Christ alone, as revealed in Scripture alone, all for the glory of God alone!"

Next Sunday, **Pastor Brad** returns and will begin the series What Really Matters with the message, "Testing God", from Malachi 3:6-12.
